



## From the Queyras massif to the Ubaye valley

**Departure Mont-Dauphin » Arrival Gap - Hike from Mont-Dauphin to Larche**  
**5 Days | 4 nights | Difficulty *PP* | Max. difficulty *PPP***

A 5-day/4-nights hike to cross one of the wildest areas of the French Alps, a preserved region which knew how to keep its authenticity. A guaranteed change of scenery in these mountains between the Mediterranean and the northern French Alps, with a foray into Italy!

**Period recommended :** July and August

Train connections from Marseille, Gap and Briançon. Bus connections to Briançon from Grenoble.

Day 1 : Gare de Mont-Dauphin - Refuge de Furfande  
Difficulty *PP* | Walking time 5h45 min | 1410 m | 100 m

Just after Mont-Dauphin, Via Alpina crosses the village of Eygliers and joins the GR® 541 heading to the Queyras regional nature park. After having passed the highest point at the Garnier pass, the trail descends again to the Furfande hut in the midst of the pastureland by the same name.

Day 2 : Refuge de Furfande - Ceillac  
Difficulty *PP* | Walking time 6h40 min | 1075 m | 1723 m

This stage leaving from the Furfande hut passes entirely along the "Tour du Queyras" trail at the heart of the Queyras regional nature park. After an abrupt descent to the Guil valley, which it crosses at the Bramousse bridge, it crosses larch woods and pastureland to reach the Bramousse pass before heading down to Ceillac, the stage destination.

Day 3 : Ceillac - Maljasset  
 Difficulty  | Walking time 5h30 min |  1088 m |  829 m

From Ceillac, the Via Alpina joins the GR® 5 to reach first the Miroir lake and then the vast Ste Anne lake at the foot of the Font-Sainte peaks. The trail then climbs to the Girardin pass, bordering the Queyras regional nature park. The descent along the Ubaye mountainside on more mineral terrain leads, after leaving the GR® 5, to the traditional hamlet of Maljasset, the stage destination.

Day 4 : Maljasset - Chiappera  
 Difficulty  | Walking time 4h50 min |  798 m |  1090 m

Just after leaving Maljasset, the trail turns off to the east into the grassy valley of Mary to reach the pass by the same name, which opens out onto Italy. The route follows the Maurin valley downwards, past Lake Sagna to the hamlet of Chiappera at the bottom of the valley, near the imposing Rocca Provenzale fortress.

Day 5 : Chiappera - Larche  
 Difficulty  | Walking time 5h10 min |  1315 m |  1259 m

From Chiappera the trail heads down briefly along Maurin Valley only to climb up the steep slopes westwards again. The route is along an old cart road to Grangia Pausa, and then along a trail. The crossing into France is made via the Sautron pass, a very mineral landscape, and then the trail heads downward through pastureland to the village of Larche, rebuilt after the war.
